Beavers	Concern: Beavers have cut down several trees and bushes on one property and the neighbor's property. LLVCC Response: USDA trapper has been contacted to trap and relocate the beavers.	
Future of Golf Course and the Country Club	Questions: What is the future of the golf course and this building? There are rumors that the Andersons are planning on selling the golf course. Can the HOA start planning and buy the golf course? LLVCC Response: This is the first time we have heard about this. We are not even certain that the rumors are truth. This will require a special assessment and vote from the community.	
Officer Election Process	Question: How do you fill Board Officers Positions? Seems insular.	
	LLVCC Response: From the Bylaws Article V Officers A Election: "At the first meeting of the Board of Directors after the annual election meeting of the members, the Board of Directors shall elect its President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer from among the Directors. One Director may hold the offices of the Secretary and Treasurer at the same time. Officers of the Association so elected shall hold office until their successors are qualified." Per Bylaws, you are required to be a Board member to become an officer.	
Fence issue	Question: Concern with a dilapidated fence- how to get attention? LLVCC Response: The first step is to talk with the neighbor about the fence. Depending on the condition, fill out a complaint as an eyesore. This may go to hearing and the hearing committee (comprised of two Board members and two or three members of the community) makes a recommendation for Board approval.	
Hearing outcomes	Comment: I want to let you know that you are doing a great job with the minutes. They are informative and capture a lot of information unlike the past years when the minutes were very minimal.

Articles of Incorporation and Division 15	Question: According to the Articles of Incorporation, any annexation requires a community vote, don't we need to have a community vote to add Division 15? When is this happening?
	LLVCC Response: Members' vote is not required for this property because the land in question is not an annexation. This land was allotted for development at a later time, it was included in the original plan. It is our understanding that all the properties owned by Andersons is considered LakeLand Village regardless of whether it was developed, is in development or allotted for future development.

We discussed our progress on the Emergency Safety Flyer to be distributed to the LLVCC community. It will depend on the type of flyer we create and the cost of printing and distributing.

We are planning to make a brief announcement in the next newsletter about what our Safety Committee is working on and that we will be looking for volunteers to help with the project.

We would also like to identify people living in the community that would have skills and be willing to help residents in the event of an emergency including a major fire, earthquake, flood, snowstorm or other major events. This could include people with chainsaws, doctors, RN's, firefighters, CPR certified, etc.

This will be a work in progress.

As other safety issues occur, our committee will respond as needed.

Sheriff's Report- Maureen Allen

This report compiled information from the Spencer and Bistro meetings.

There is an effort and not yet concluded with Thurston County to establish a combined county animal control facility. Special guest Sgt. Jason Roe shared his responsibilities within Mason and Thurston County.

The previous history of reported fatalities was 10-15 per year. 2024 there were 7.

The illegal left-hand turns at McDonalds in Belfair have increased easy ticketing and fines. The most complained location is the intersection of Hwy 3 and Johns Prairie Rd.

Question: How do you coordinate between agencies to address incidents? Radio frequencies and will respond if available. Spencer Lake and Phillips Lake are experiencing high crime events. An attendee said that since a slow or no response from deputies, the matter will be handled by residents in the area. The Sheriff advised not to do that as they could end up in jail and do report all incidents.

So far 173 thousand pounds of garbage has been removed from the encampments on Hwy 3.

Mason County has 2 permanently assigned state patrol offices. State Patrol is funded for 12 officers but only has 7. Their academy did have 46 cadets but is now down to 39. There is a shortage of State Patrol vehicles as they are continually getting struck by drunk drivers.

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	The Rapid Development Team will respond to disaster emergencies. The Skokomish Indian Tribe is now under Federal Control no longer Mason County. Illegal Alien Laws restrict ability to function. Meth is now the #1 killer drug over fentanyl. If tagging is found anywhere in, take pictures and paint over it and send pictures to the police. If other gangs view it, they will attempt territory revenge. Attendee announced that the 1932 Navy Building, now Belfair Grade School, is in disrepair and a new school is much needed.
